Topic: Professional Development Training Relating to Dysgraphia

Summary: House Bill 2768 (the "Bill") amends OKLA. STAT. tit. 70, § 6-194, which outlines

required professional development programs to be put in place by district boards

of education for certified teachers and administrators.

Dysgraphia Training and the Dyslexia and Dysgraphia Handbook

Prior to this legislation, professional development programs were required to include training regarding dyslexia but not dysgraphia. Now, training relating to both disabilities must be provided annually for all teachers and administrators. Dysgraphia training must be offered beginning with the 2023–2024 school year.

The Bill also requires the State Department of Education (the "SDOE") to update its *Dyslexia Handbook* to include information related to dysgraphia. The new *Dyslexia and Dysgraphia Handbook* will continue to be reviewed and revised at least every three (3) years. In reviewing the handbook, the SDOE's Dyslexia Task Force will study how to effectively identify students with dysgraphia, identify appropriate measures for assisting those students, and make recommendations for resources and interventions.
